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outance was overcome as this was a test case for me also involving my "reputation". Saturn/Jupiter Ketu Mars Rasi Ascdt Mars Mercury Rahu Moon Sun Venus My analysis which I now find was somewhat round about, was a follows: As the second Drekkana of Sagittarius was rising, the 6th refers to the chest, and the 5th to the heart and the 12th to the navel. The 4th lord Jupiter was much afflicted because of his association with Ketu. Lord of the 8th the Moon was debilitated in the 12th and aspecting Jupiter. The 6th house was subject to a Papakartari Guna, planets involved being Saturn and Mars. Of all these houses, the 7th was most afflicted because of the presence of Mars and the aspect of Saturn. Mars was in the 7th house, a maraka. I said, "The heart will be the seat of the trouble. The native may be suffering from pain in the heart region and sometimes may find it difficult to breathe". The doctor remarked, "Your diagnosis confirms my suspicion. The patient has some coronary problems and I shall now be able to decide on the line of treatment." I continued, "Mars Dasa for the patient will commence in July 1937. Mars as lord of the 12th (and the 5th) being placed in the 7th, a maraka, could cause the death of the patient, especially that the Moon, lord of the 8th, occupies the 12th with Mercury and Rahu. Your patient may not survive the year 1937. He does not have poorayna (full term)". The doctor again met me by the end of 1937 to "congratulate" me for what he called "a remarkable prediction". My forays into political astrology had started with the collection of data of the founding of nations and horoscopes of world leaders. The Dutch astrologer Karl Kraft had supplied me with authoritative birth details of Hitler, Churchill, Roosevelt and Lord of the Winds. The German Emperor Kaiser Wilhelm II was born on 26-1-1892. The 16th star of the 12th house was Mars. The 12th house was afflicted by Saturn and Mars. The 12th house was the house of the collapse of the Ethiopian army for sheer want of modern equipments of warfare, had made the Italians masters of Abyssinia. Mussolini had already announced the annexation of Ethiopia and King Victor Emanuel had already become the "Emperor" of the conquered land. The Negus fled to the United Kingdom reposing complete faith in the League of Nations. My first article on Mundane astrology, written after a careful consideration of the astrological and international factors, was on "The League and Ethiopia". Grandfather appreciated the article. But as usual his appreciation was hedged in with the remark, "It could have been better written". Of course this criticism was well meant. Had he showered unqualified appreciation, I would perhaps have felt that no improvement was needed. If some of the editorial articles written by me in the fifties and sixties were hailed as master-pieces, the credit must indirectly go to grandfather. 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to Sastry's assistance in this direction in my book HOROSCOPES, N.C.Lall, Editor of a monthly astrological journal Celestial Messenger and his son R.N. Lall, a high school teacher, also met me the same night and took me to their residence. I knew the Lalls by correspondence as I was an occasional contributor to Celestial Messenger. Our discussion ranged over several aspects of astrology. The senior Lall, about 60 then, well-read and cultured, said that in calculating the ruling Dasa at birth, the constellation to be taken into account should be either the one occupied by the Moon or the Lagna, whichever was stronger. This was the first line that I heard about in considering the constellation of the Lagna. Lall said, "This principle was revealed to me by my Guru. I have tried it in a number of cases and found it quite satisfactory. Take your own case. Your Lagna is about 11° Aquarius - Satabhisha 2 leaving a balance of about 11 years and 9 months in Rahu Dasa which ended about May 1924. In Saturn in Jupiter there was a break in your education. In Mercury's sub-period you were married. You are now having the Moon in Jupiter, enabling you to have dips in sacred rivers and establish your name. The end of Mercury which commences in your 65th year can prove fatal as Mercury is a maraka. I have tested scores of horoscopes and find the principle working". I nodded my head and asked him on what basis he considered my Lagna constellation, in preference to that of the Moon. He explained, "Because the Lagna is stronger than the Moon, as Lagna is aspected by lord of Lagna and three other palnets." I interjected, "Is not the Moon stronger than the Lagna?" He is exalted, is with the ascendant lord and is aspected by Jupiter causing Gajakesari Yoga. And what is the authority for your thesis?". Lall said the authority was Brihat Parasara Hora. The discussion ended there. This problem set by Lall was always working in my mind, till I came in possession of Satya Samhita, wherein the Sage says: (...) The meaning is clear that the Dasas should be calculated on the basis of the Nakshatra of the Lagna or the Moon whichever is stronger. But my experience all these years and the innumerable Nadis I have seen have convinced me that the Moon's Nakshatra alone is to be considered. Vimshottari is also called Udu Dasa. The Moon is Udupa or the lord of constellations. Hence, it is my opinion, formed after decades of study and experiment that the Dasa should be based on the position of the Moon alone. 23 The railway journey from Varanasi to Calcutta on the night of 6th March 1938 was uncomfortable, what with all sorts of people crowded together in the third class compartment. At the Wheeler's railway book stall at Varanasi, I had picked up a copy of Dr. Alexander Cannon's THE INVISIBLE INFLUENCE, a remarkable book dealing with such subjects as "Mind over Master", "Psychology and the Occult", "Some Psychic Phenomena", etc. Those were the days when many an educated indian had surrendered his ability to appreciate the uniqueness of his own culture to Western thinking. Forty-three years after the so-called political independence things do not appear to have changed. On the other hand they have deteriorated. Effects of dreams, psychic phenomena, astrology, etc., discovered by our ancient seers and sages, and borne out in actual practice are being labelled as 'superstitious' in the name of scientific temper and rationalism, just because of the intellectual slavery we arc still suffering from. Dr. Cannon, an M.D., Ph.D., etc., asserts in the pages of this book that "Black Magic does exist and the Biblical doctrine of Demonicstic theory of Insanity would appear to be more scientific than our 'lip-service' psychology of today". Giving a number of instances of black magic, control over the mind, etc., Dr. Cannon says: "The Western methods of hypnotism and telepathy, good as they are, in no way equal to those of the Aryan Hindu Masters who hold all the secrets ever discovered by man with regard to the control of the mind of another" and that "India and Tibet can teach us more about psychology and the workings of the mind than any Freud, Jung, Alder or the exponent of any other new thought movement". A reading of the work during the journey again revived my interest in mantra sastra and recalled to my memory of my early experiences with Ibrahim. I arrived at Calcutta on the 7th morning and the first thing I did after leaving my luggage at a South Indian hotel in Chittaranjan Avenue was to visit Mr. Fakir Chandra Dutt with whom I had been in correspondence for some years. Engaging a rickshaw I waded through several lanes to locate Mr. Dutt's house at 69, Amherst Row. He was already aged and ailing. After a preliminary discussion about the merits of the Sayana and Nirayana systems - he was of course a follower of the Sayana - I expressed my desire to meet a genuine mantric as Calcutta was said to be famous for mantrics. Mr. Dutt sent a guide who took me to the Kali temple. My first reaction was one of abhorrence at the sight of innocent animals being sacrificed. After a reluctant darshan of Goddess Kali, I was taken to a nearby house and introduced to a mansion who was bedecked with all the paraphalia generally associated in popular minds with such persons. To demonstrate his powers, he took two broomsicks each about 6 inches long, made them stand before the image of the deity and as he went on uttering some mantras, the broom-sticks began to dance. It looked as if they obeyed his commands. To "prove" his claim that he could read or communicate ideas through the media of thought, he wanted me to jot down whatever I desired on a piece of paper. I wrote down in Kannada script, half a dozen names of my ancestors. The mantric asked me to think what I wrote which I did. He revealed my thoughts. For a moment I was simply flabbergasted. I asked him: "What are the processes involved in reading others' thoughts? How can we send messages through thoughtwaves?" His explanation was that by practising certain kshudra mantras and bringing the deity concerned under one's control one could easily read others' thoughts. I pressed him further to say whether his expertise in mantra sastra enabled him to predict the past, present and future. Almost apologetically he replied: "Yes, we can". I was mentally getting ready to counter his onslaughts by silently reciting Gayatri mantra. He said: "Your past is unhappy. You have no mother. You are embarking on a work which promises no success." It was my turn to speak. "Your reading is not correct I know you will not be able to probe the past or look into the future. I had made my mind impervious to your thought-vibrations." He took the cue and dismissed me. I narrated my experience to Dutt. He said there were several such fakes in Calcutta while real mantrics kept aloof from public gaze. Dutt had specialised in Western astrological teachings. I had carefully read his Predictive Astrology. The last book Astro-Palmistry presented to me by Dutt "as a token of my sincere love and kindest regards" was on 7th January 1953. He revealed that though he practised Western Astrology based on the Sayana zodiac he relied much on the "old Hindu method of House Division, also advocated by Ptolemy." I differed from him in several matters including methods employed in lining events. He would emphasise on primary and secondary directions on which I have had my own reservations. In fact, I could convince even Carter that the only reliable methods of timing events were the Dasa systems propounded in Hindu Astrology. According to Dutt, the period by directing the cusp of the 8th house for instance to the place of the Sun in the 8th would show a breakdown of health. He would also employ the solar revolutions, etc. In fact Dutt worked out secondary directions for my 27th year (to commence 8th August 1938) and predicted a windfall for me. Of course it did not happen. Dutt also said that important events of life very often could be ascertained by considering the zodiac from the ascendant indicative of 100 years. Thus 1 year measures 3° 36', and 1 month measures 18'. The chart is divided into 4 parts or quadrants - ascendant to mid-heaven (25 years), mid-heaven to descendant (26 to 50), descendant to the 4th house (50 to 75) and 4th house to the ascendant (75 to 100). For example say Mars is at a distance of 12° from the meridian. At the age of 28 years roughly (25 + 3) the native sustains an accident With due deference to Dutt, I must say that the system has certain flaws and is not foolproof. Why should 100 years be allotted to the entire zodiac instead of 120 years considered in Vimshottari? Of course factors like the yogas, afflictions, etc., cannot be ignored. In 1941, I wrote to Dutt pointing out my apprehensions about the system suggested by him. Dutt was modest enough to agree. I fully endorsed his view that "astral factors only show the tendencies" and the exact effects "will depend on the heredity, environment and character of the native". Dutt was of course the first in India in recent years to write a book on Prenatal Astrology though germs of the theory are to be found in classical works like Brihat Parasara Hora, Brihat Jataka, etc. "Relying on Ptolemy and drawing liberally from Hindu astrology, E.H. Bailey brought out his Prenatal Epoch long before Dutt's book. The method has as its basis the theory that the ascendant degree and the longitude of the Moon at conception interchange with the longitude of the Moon and the degree ascending at birth, or their respective opposite points. Over the years I experimented with this method and many articles have also appeared in THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE. I found that it was not quite reliable. But it does offer scope for research. These are of course my own views. It is interesting to note that even Ram Dayalu in his Sanketanidhi refers to predicting the nature of effects in the future on the basis of the Moon's position, prior to birth. In the course of further discussions Dutt revealed that Mihiracharya, a pen-name assumed by a well-known palmist of those days, outlined the methods of tracing birth details and the horoscope from the palm and these principles were adumbrated in a recent book Astro Palmistry, a copy of which was given to me. My first experience of my horoscope being traced from my palm was with a Nadi astrologer in Madras in 1935 and I was naturally interested in knowing more about the relation of palmistry to astrology. The age of the Moon, the month of birth, the signs occupied by the different planets are supposed to be revealed by a certain manipulation of the vertical lines on the 2nd and 3rd phalanges of the different ringers. For example, the vertical lines on the 2nd and 3rd phalanges of both the hands are totalled. This is added to a basic number 32, the result multiplied by 7 and the product divided by 15, is said to give the age of the Moon or the lunar day of birth. The whole difficulty is in correctly calculating the vertical lines, as some will be well formed and some will be faint. I have already referred, in a previous chapter, to a method suggested in Hindu palmistry to trace the birth chart. After carrying out much study and research in this subject, I felt that the results were not worth the time and labour spent. On the contrary, the methods suggested in Prasna Margha for finding out unknown horoscopes appeared to me to be more reliable. In the 50's I met a palmist in Bangalore who was able to trace the horoscope by considering not only the lines on the palm but also the lines on the heels. He was successful in a number of cases. After some meetings, he said he was an upasaka of a kshudra devata which revealed the birth details. During my first visit to the United States in 1959 I was able to trace the birth time and Lagna from the palm of Charles Jayne, a well-known astrologer who died recently and Mr. Ernest Grant, the first Secretary of the American Federation of Astrologers. It is for budding scholars in astrology and palmistry to make further research into the subject of astro Palmistry and convince themselves. I returned to Bombay for a further stay of one week, with a view to having some more consultations and securing subscribers to THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE. This time I rented a room (Rs. 30/ per month) at Matunga. Chubb, an officer in a Bank was the first to meet me, of course, at the instance of B.H. Canoo. He was a young man of 36, fair looking and deeply interested in astrology. Placing his horoscope in my hands he said: "God has been good to me in all matters. But still I am suffering a lot mentally. Can you analyse my problem and advise me?" Hesitating for a moment, I asked him what his problem was. His reply was, "Well, you are an expert astrologer and it is for you to find out." I checked up the casting and reflecting on the chart for a few minutes I said: "You are born in Kalsarpa Yoga, all the planets being hemmed in between Rahu and Ketu. Rahu in Lagna no doubt gives you interest in occultism, astrology etc., but his being aspected by Mars leads to an obsession with those things. You are self-willed, sometimes eccentric and often changeful. The 1st, 6th and 7th houses are involved. This makes you highly sensual and I will not be surprised if you have a problem with your head, something like migraine, bouts of headache." Beaming with a smile Chubb said, "Yes, you have correctly said about my nature and about one problem. Is there any other problem that you think important "Yes," I proceeded, "lord of. the 7th Mars is with the Sun, a malefic aspecting the ascendant, and in turn, aspected by Saturn. Ketu afflicts the 7th house. It is the marital problem." Chubb, waving his hand, observed: "But Venus is well-placed and can influence marriage for good." I retorted "No. Venus is with Mercury, an impotent planet, in the house of an impotent Saturn and subject to papakarthari yoga. Venus is weak." Quoting a stanza from a classical work - (...) Sun Mars Ketu Rahu Mere Venus RASI NAVAMSA Sat Ascdt Ketu Jup Sat Moon Ascdt. Rahu Moon Sun Mars Venus I said: "Venus is weak implying that you may be pre-disposed towards sex diseases. The wife may be an enemy and may reject you, unless both of you conduct towards each other in a manner that will conduce to mutual understanding." Chubb became somewhat morose. Tears trickling down his cheeks he said: "The main problem has been pinpointed by you. I and my wife have never seen eye to eye with each other." I told him: "Ketu in the 7th threatens domestic harmony, jealousy, and even deceit." Chubb met me several times after this first meeting. The husband and wife lived together but as strangers. My stay at Bombay for a few days was fruitful. I could do some professional work besides enabling a few subscribers for THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE, which, by then, eighteen months old, was suffering from strokes of Balakrishna, Ganoo introduced me to A.C. Mujumdar, Manager of Hindustan Life Insurance Company. He and his immediate assistant Patel were quite influential people and to some extent, knowledgeable in astrology too. Mukherji who, in 1944, introduced me to Sarat Bose, elder brother of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, was interested to know how by looking at a chart one could know the sex of the native. Somehow I had not considered this question important. According to the method suggested by Varaha Mihira (vide Brihat Jataka, Nishkekadhaya* verse 11), according as the Lagna, the Sun, and the Moon occupy movable, fixed or common signs or Navamsas the sex of the person would be male, female or hermaphrodite. Actually this method is to be applied for ascertaining the sex of a child to be born on the basis of the conception chart. In actual practice however I applied it to birth horoscopes and found it useful. According to a method given to me by Palaniswamy, to whom reference has been made in an earlier Chapter, the Navamsa-Dwadasasamsa (N-D) one-twelfth division of a Navamsa (16° 40') should be the deciding factor. Here only odd and even signs are considered to indicate the male and female sexes. Suppose the Ascendant is Libra 10° 30'. The Navamsa will be Makara or Capricorn (10° to 13° 20'). The arc covered upto Makara N-D extends till 10° 33' 20'. Since the Lagna is 10° 30', the N-D will be Kumbha or Aquarius, an odd sign, indicating male sex. In practice, this method has been found to be quite workable as the interval involved is 16° 40' (equivalent in time to approximately 1m. 9s). After I came into contact with Nadi literature and after having studied scores of horoscopes in the light of nadi amsas I came to the conclusion that a correct identification of the nadi amsa could enable one to hit at the correct time of birth, and of course, the sex of the person also. I expect to deal with this subject more extensively in the articles on Nadi Jyotisha which I am hoping to serialize in THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE at early date. Problems connected with THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE and an urgent summons from Rajeswari made me cut short my stay at Bombay and I returned to Bangalore on 15th March after an absence of nearly five weeks. 24 As the year 1938 advanced developments on the European political scene were disturbing and events had been transpiring with the rapidity of lightning. Deadly changes were taking place in Germany. Hitler's shadow was gradually falling on Europe. But his countrymen considered Hitler a patriotic German. He was not only in power but his cherished ambition of acquiring Austria had been fulfilled. The rejuvenation of German youth was in swift progress. Mussolini was anxious to safeguard his empire in Africa, but I had already indicated in THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE that the Negus, emperor of Abyssinia (Ethiopia) then in exile in London, would get back his empire. The League of Nations was impotent to check Mussolini who conducted his campaign in Abyssinia in a ruthless manner. In March 1938 Austria was militarily occupied by Hitler and Europe was confronted with a programme of aggression and Hitler was encouraged to pursue his designs against Czechoslovakia. The horoscopes of the countries threatened by Hitler were being duly discussed by me in THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE and predictions made about his future. The danger to world peace was clear. Would there be a world war? If so, when? European astrologers, especially the British, were vague in their forecasts as their interpretations were highly coloured by subjective factors. It was at this time that I decided to publish a small book entitled World Prospects in 1939 and 1940, to give a kaleidoscopic outline of the future of the world. How should I proceed? Where would I get the data needed to forecast world events? What methods should I employ. These were the thoughts then uppermost in my mind. I had made an exhaustive study of Brihat Samhita, Garga Samhita, Argha Jataka and other collateral works. I was at home with the works of Ptolemy, Placidius Titus, William Lilly, Simonnite and Zadkiel. I had made a series of observations to correlate developments in the histories of India, U.S.A., etc. with the transits of major planets - Saturn, Jupiter, Mars and Rahu in certain zodiacal signs. I had also experimented with the lunar year charts and the significance of planetary positions in respect of the signs ascending at the capitals of different countries. In fact, the well-known British astrologer E.H. Bailey for whose magazine British Journal of Astrology I was an occasional contributor since 1930, was all praise for the modus operandi employed by me. I would give pride of place to lunar year charts, as just before entering Aries, the Sun and the Moon would be in conjunction significantly indicating trends in the year ahead. I would give equal prominence to the horoscopes of the rulers of the countries. The fact that I was also practising certain meditational techniques and a key-mantra not only enrgised my sub-conscious mind but gave me a confidence, which I now feel, was something unparalleled. With all this equipment at my command I felt confident of making forecasts about world affairs. By September 1938, Chamberlain was in complete control of British foreign policy. But he was dubbed as a man of appeasement. In his meetings with Hitler both on 15th September and 22nd September, 1938, for averting war he practically yielded to Hitler's black-mail. Chamberlain's verbal duels with Hitler had the aim of "Peace at any price". Dealing with the effects of the solar ingress into Cancer on 16-7-1938, in the July-September 1939 issue of THE ASTROLOGICAL MAGAZINE published in the first week of June, I said, after discussing the astrological rulerships of different countries, "The effects of the ingress will be felt for a period of three months beginning with the day of the entry". The Ascendant has fallen on the cusp of Scorpio thereby extending the influences to Dhanus also which rules Spain, lower Italy, and a part of France. The Ascendant receives no other beneficial aspects. What wonder is there if we anticipate sudden political developments in almost all the countries mentioned above? Aries rules England. It is not aspected by malefics but it is hemmed in between two of the worst malefics Ketu and Saturn thus causing papakarthariyoga. This will undoubtedly cause Britain to adopt a most unsatisfactory foreign policy which would provide much material for comment and criticism. Her powers of judgement will be marred and there will be further entreaties to maintain a closer contact with Italy and extolling of Anglo-Italian friendship as a stabilising factor. Further revolutions are indicated in France. A plot is being hatched by Fascist elements, according to astrological indications, to overthrow the democracy. Mussolini certainly views with concern the sudden expansion of the German frontier right upto Italy. It is natural therefore that he is willing to free himself from German entanglement, but the time at which the Anglo-Italian Agreement was signed does not seem to be propitious for him to get into better relations with England. "Hitler is at present having a good time. He would have nothing to fear from either Britain or France to check his aggressive designs against Holland and Czechoslovakia, both of which Hitler seems to be bent on absorbing into Germany. Aquarius rules Abyssinia. Jupiter and the Moon are situated there aspected by Venus and Mars. The hands of Ethiopians will be strengthened and Italy will suffer many reverses. Her authority as guardian of Ethiopia will be questioned and Ethiopia will be able to liberate a portion of the vast empire from the hands of the aggressor. The conjunctions of the Sun and Mars in Cancer increases the driving ambition for world power by dictator countries with actions furthering their private aggrandisement. Saturn's presence in zeta piscium will have grave consequences on Portugal, Spain and Egypt giving rise to assassinations and severe political struggles." Again commenting on the Anglo-Italian Agreement in the same issue, I wrote as follows: "According to press reports, the Anglo-Italian Agreement was signed on 16-4-1938 at 6.30 p.m. at Rome. At this time Libra was rising with the Moon there. Rahu in the second, Jupiter in the fifth. Saturn in the sixth. Mercury, the Sun and Venus in the 7th and Mars and Ketu in the eighth. The very fact that Britain has entered into a pact with Italy hits a crushing blow to the principle of justice. That Great Britain being afraid of the strength of Rome-Berlin axis has played a painfully unworthy part, unworthy of its great traditions is a belief which every right-minded individual seems to share. "As has been pointed out several times, this kind of degrading show which England has taken upon itself to run, is due to the presence of Saturn in the 12th from Aries ruling England. Lord of the Ascendant Venus is hemmed in between Saturn on one side and Mars and Ketu on the other. The sub-period of Venus in the major period of Jupiter remains with a balance of about 2 years. Venus is lord of the 8th. In the Navamsa Venus is the lord of the 2nd and 7th. In the 8th or house of death, there are Mars and Ketu aspected by Saturn. Therefore it is evident that there are many difficulties on the way preventing the smooth working of the agreement". To think that mutual interest and a sense of realism have been the dominating factors in bringing about this agreement is to betray one's ignorance. Planets clearly indicate that it is not compatible with international security for this recognition, sold as pan of an imperialist bargain (Sun in the 7th) and that it undermines the foundations upon which international confidence rests. It imperils the security of the British Commonwealth (Saturn being in the 12th from Aries), and it shows lack of the most elementary sense of reality". "There is no hope of Italy holding its authority over the Ethiopian people triumphantly. The League when it was alive was used by England as a lever for the paltry purpose of winning an election. Now its dead body is to be used for proclaiming the triumph of inequity and the stability of unconscionable prevarication. Planets do not indicate that Italy would adhere to the terms of the agreement". The new year's chart for Pramadi (1939-40) carried adequate destructive elements to disturb the peace of the world. At Berlin 25° Scorpio rose and the lord of Lagna Mars occupying the war-like sign Sagittarius was powerfully aspected by Saturn. The Sun, the Moon and Mercury were all subjected to the powerful aspect of Mars, while the meridian point was aspected by Saturn. Rahu was in the 12th aspected by Jupiter but he was powerful in his constellation. Mars occupied Moola ruled by Ketu. Based upon the above astrological factors plus an intuitive perception, I made the following observations in the WORLD PROSPECTS IN 1939 and 1940 published in August 1938. "In the scramble for world power, nations have begun to cut each other's throats. Diplomats and politicians have become thoroughly impotent to check the aggressive forces at work. The League of Nations has become a meeting place for treaty-breaking countries. 'What next?' is the question that each puts to the other. Will there be a next war? Will aggression stop? Will Providence take care of countries guilty of the most flagrant violation of international law, international justice and international morality? We are constrained to say that the so-called universal peace would be a delusion. Affairs in Europe will rapidly develop launching a second and final ultimatum on 3rd September. And the world received with astonishment the declaration of war upon Germans of Britain and France. The 2000 copies of WORLD PROSPECTS IN 1939 and 1940 (priced at 8 annas or 50 paise) was sold within 6 months and resulted in several persons in different walks of life contacting me for horoscopic readings. I had not yet ceased to be a professional but considered myself as an adviser and consultant. One such person who met me was a City Magistrate of Bangalore. I shall call him Murthy for obvious reasons. The outbreak of war had upset him so much that he had almost become a nervous wreck and his mental state had even come in the way of his discharging his official duties. He considered himself a stick person and wanted to know whether there would be any relief. Saturn Moon Ketu Mars Venus Sun Moon Merc. Jup. Mars Merc. Rahu RASI NAVAMSA Lagna Ketu Sun Jupiter Venus Lagna Saturn Rahu Murthy said: "I want you to please check up the correctness of my horoscope and tell me when my marriage will take place." This was a ticklish question requiring not only astrological ability but also common sense. I was married when I was 18. Murthy was 16 years older than me and naturally he could not have got married about my age according to the then prevailing practice. This was of course my reasoning. Would the ruling Dasa and Bhukti say at the age of 18 to 21, warrant the happening of this event? In this case the Dasa of Rahu ruled from August 1906 to August 1924. I said after explaining the chart, "Lords of Lagna and Kalatrakaraka Venus are near each other. This means marriage can take place early in life. Rahu is in the 7th and the lord of the sign occupied by him is exalted. Therefore the marriage can take place in Rahu Dasa." Murthy interjected: "You mean before Rahu Dasa ends in 1924?" I went on: "You should not be hasty. I can specify the exact period. Ketu is in Lagna. Moreover the Sun, lord of Lagna, will be transiting the 7th between 14th February to 14th March. Jupiter will be transiting Aries about the same time. Taking all these into consideration I dare say that your marriage will have taken place in February-March 1927". Surprised, Murthy expressed joy and complimented me for my "hitting the bull's eye". Saturn was transiting Cancer and aspecting radical Venus. I ignored this phenomenon and took a chance in giving the probable month. He said he was married on 25-2-1917. Analysing the chart further I observed "Rahu should give the results of Saturn. Saturn is exalted in the 3rd. He is the Yogakaraka from Chandra Lagna. But he is in the constellation of Jupiter occupying the 12th house. Until the end of Rahu Dasa in August 1924, there is no chance of your entering service. As soon as Jupiter Dasa started you will have entered Government service. Jupiter though in the 12th is lord of the 5th and occupies the constellation of Saturn, a Yogakaraka, who aspects Venus, lord of the 10th" Murthy was so overwhelmed with joy at meeting with "such a great astrologer" that he burst out: "Yes, I joined Government service in September 1924." My ego had been satisfied and I was confident that I would be able to identify his illness and advise him. Analysing the various combinations I said: "Your Lagna is Leo. Generally those born in this sign enjoy good health. But because Ketu is in Lagna inviting the aspect of Rahu, due to self-indulgence you are likely to suffer chronic trouble involving the digestive system. Lord of the 5th Jupiter being aspected by Saturn lord of the 6th, there is a tendency to consume rich foods resulting in digestive problems. Ketu's situation in Lagna causes trouble of some kind or the other through allowing the senses, feelings and emotions to sway the reason. The same position makes you consciously or unconsciously take on the castings of the surroundings. Ketu rules weird feelings and gives a visionary trend of mind. The receptivity to psychic conditions may run to extremes allowing the feelings to get the better of judgement. There is a tendency to excitability, morbid imagination, wandering disposition and strange feelings." Raising his hand Murthy remarked: "As a magistrate I can study the psychology of criminals. But you have analysed my mental disposition in such a way that I endorse every word of what you have said. But what about my illness?" I explained to him: "You are now having Ratio's sub-period in Jupiter's major period. This goes under the name of Dasa-chidra. Transit Saturn is in Pisces aspecting the Moon and Mercury, the planets ruling the mind and emotions. It looks as though your problem is psycho-somatic. You are readily affected both mentally and physically, by the psychic conditions of the environment. This also causes mental confusion, nervousness, fear and apprehension. The outbreak of the war need not worry you, as it does not affect your interests. If you take care of your digestive system and emotions, your problem gets solved." Murthy was satisfied and was about to take leave of me when I interjected and cautioned him: "Rahu, whose sub-period you are having, is in the 7th house. This threatens domestic troubles, illness to partner and a feeling of sickness. Developments in the household cause you much misery. Astrology being a science of tendencies you should not take my analysis as deterministic. After Saturn's major period commences things will improve and you will get over your troubles." I dismissed Murthy after recommending suitable remedial measures. 25 The latter half of 1938, just about the time of commencement of Saturn's sub-period in the Dasa of Jupiter in my horoscope, saw my gradual emergence into literary activities, though financially things did not improve much. HINDU PREDICTIVE ASTROLOGY and VARSHAPHAL were ready for publication. I had completed GRAHA AND BHEVA BALAS. I started working on VARSHAPHAL and THREE HUNDRED IMPORTANT COMBINATIONS. But I had neither the resources nor any influential backing for getting these books printed. One day in July 1938, when I was ruminating as to what to do R. Gopalakrishna Rao (Meena) unexpectedly called on me to seek my help for bringing out his book on Nodi Astrology. For me it was like a blind man leading another blind man. With a view to convincing me of what he called the "correctness of his Nodi System", Meena took up my horoscope and went on analysing the results of Saturn in Jupiter. He said: "Sir, I have found that Nodi Astrology as taught to me by my Guru is quite accurate. In your own case, lord of the 2nd Jupiter is situated in the constellation of yogakaraka Saturn, so your financial position throughout life will be good. Jupiter, dhanaakaraka, is also well disposed indicating financial prosperity". I did not want to tell Meena that I was yet to reach a stage when I could say that I was well off. I was also not much interested in his reading of my horoscope. But we met a few times discussing his manuscript on Nodi Astrology. Though I expressed frankly where I dissented from his theory, I told him that the book was worth publishing and that I would help him to get a good printer. Meena, then probably about 45, was a signaller in the Railways drawing about Rs. 80 per month. He had a large family. There was no family planning in those days and poverty never came in the way of begetting. God willing, as many children as possible. He would also earn Rs. 20 to Rs. 30 per month by way of consultations. I found Meena unassuming, frank and friendly, and well-up in his subject. It was then that he explained to me the so-called subs dividing a constellation into nine parts in proportion to the ruling periods of the nine planets. The results of planets in different constellations and the timing of the nature of the results of a Dasa lord, on the basis of his situation in particular constellation etc., as given by Meena are worth study and research. I applied these rules to a number of horoscopes and found the results fairly satisfactory. I arranged with the Modi Printing Press to get the I and II parts of his Nadi Jyotisha printed. In 1958 when K.S. Krishna Murthy met me to explain his so-called 'paddhati', I reminded him that the germ of the theory was revealed by Meena and that mixing up Meena's Nadi system, some principles of Hindu Astrology and a few western theories would not constitute a new 'system!' I suggested that he gave due acknowledgement to R. Gopalakrishna Rao, as he was the first to mention the so-called subs. Murthy apparently did not like my advice. Meena's theory was that because Jupiter in my case was in the constellation of Anuradha, ruled by Saturn, Saturn would give the results of Jupiter. But I had my own reservations.
